



Our beautiful Hadlow Main Campus

Our main campus is set in beautiful surroundings - a large managed estate including over 265 acres of prime arable land, woodland, a cross-country course, sports facilities, natural river, three commercial farms, established show gardens and horticultural glasshouses, lakes and other natural habitats. Including our brand new sustainable orchard and vineyard with all the latest technologies to learn sustainable farming techniques.

Faulkner's Farm

Our fully functioning commercial farm is home to the College flock of 350 ewes, lambing sheds and 66 hectares of rotational grazing. Students are involved with lambing, shearing and care of the flock.

Blackman's Farm

Home to our herd of beef cattle. As well as land for grazing, the farm which extends to 57 hectares is also used for arable crop and forage production. We also have very close links with local dairy farms giving our students an all round experience with dairy and beef.

Equestrian

Our superb Equestrian stabling for 64 horses along with two international size indoor arenas, outdoor arenas, paddocks and a cross country course. We regularly host competitions and lecture demonstrations from famous riders and trainers such as Mary and Emily King, Mark Todd and Monty Roberts.

National Centre for Reptile Welfare (NCRW)

The facility, the first of its type in the United Kingdom, provides refuge and care for up to 600 unwanted and vulnerable reptiles and amphibians. Its aim is to rehome them through a national network of retailers and wholesalers, as well as improve the body of knowledge around the care and needs of these animals.

Animal Management

Our Animal Management Unit is one of the country's leading educational animal collections. The collection houses over 500 animals from over 125 different species, which all the students study to develop their skills and expertise. With state-of-theart aquatics, herpetology and nocturnal sections, students have the opportunity to experience a diverse range of working environments, while the opportunity to work with exotic carnivores, canids and mongoose species provide our students with first-class experience in a zoo environment. Many of the species we house are endangered and are part of national and international collaborative programmes with other UK zoos. The collection also has a substantial range of domestic species including pigs, goats, alpacas and poultry.

Horticulture

Our Horticultural facilities comprises of a brand new glasshouse complex, access to fruit orchards and field production facilities. Exciting new automated and sustainable developments with our 3 hectare robotic orchard producing apples, pears, cherries and other crops using the latest harvest and management tools / equipment and robots. A vineyard looking at the production requirements for English wine and grape juice. A new commercial nursery was introduced during 2022 comprising glasshouses with hydroponic growing facilities.

We have very well-equipped state-of -the-art workshops where engineering students have a vast array of specialist tools to hand to carry out all sorts of engineering projects. The workshop, which has recently been extended, has 540 square metres of floor space to accommodate many kinds of projects, from vintage and classic tractor restorations to modern tractors and implements that need fault diagnosis with the aid of a laptop.

Broadview Gardens & Garden Centre

Comprising 4 hectares of beautiful individually designed themed gardens built by Hadlow staff and students, as well as a commercial garden centre, Broadview offers a great place to escape when you fancy a break from studying.

Fisheries Hatchery

Our fully-stocked hatchery contains various species of tropical and cold water fish, in different types of industry-specific systems. Students learn about different methods of fish welfare, accommodation and husbandry.

We have over 50 aquarium tanks and several advanced Recirculating Aquaculture Systems which incorporate industry standard equipment such as commercial drum filters.

Floristry

We have chillers, bespoke classrooms for floristry and cutting gardens.

Grove Farm Fishing Lake

Comprising a 2-hectare mixed coarse fishing lake and growing on ponds. Grove Farm operates as a commercial fishery and fish farm, providing our students with practical skills in carp husbandry, modern fisheries management practises and all aspects of fish farming and relevant legislation.

Agricultural Engineering

Royal Borough of Greenwich Equestrian Skills & Riding Centre

Specialist courses available in Equestrian:

Part of the London 2012 Olympic legacy, these completely bespoke facilities take full advantage of its unique heritage. With on-site equine spa, water treadmill, hydrotherapy pool, indoor arena, mechanical horse and outdoor manège, as well as stabling for 26 horses, this is one of the few places in London where you can study an equine-related subject.

Student Welfare

We know that going to college can be a daunting experience, especially if transitioning from school. To help you settle in and enjoy your time with us, we offer a wide range of support.

This was recognised during our last Ofsted Residential Care Inspection when the College achieved a 'Good', with no recommendations for the guidance and support offered by all staff. At the start of your course, you will be assigned a Personal Tutor who will guide and monitor you during your time at Hadlow. In your one-to-one tutorials, you will have the chance to discuss careers, health, and social education as well as academic progress.

The tutorial programme gives you the chance to engage in topics outside of your main study and includes topics like drugs and alcohol education, LGBTQ, celebrating black history and how to keep yourself and others safe online. You will also have individual tutorial sessions with your tutor, so they can get to know you and support you academically. For further education students, academic review evenings are held in the autumn and spring terms sothat parents/guardians can discuss progress.

Equal Opportunities to Succeed

We are proud to provide an environment where equality of opportunity is embedded, and diversity celebrated in everything we do. We expect anyone studying at the College to contribute towards this environment so that it remains a welcoming and inclusive place to study and to live. All students can benefit from impartial careers advice and guidance through one to one appointments at the dedicated Careers Hub, workshops and group tutorials. During the year, the College runs industry-specific careers fairs and higher education workshops.

Our Chaplaincy team offers support for everyone. To help you in your personal and spiritual growth, we have a dedicated Contemplation Room for prayer and quiet reflection, and we can also support you in making contact with local faith groups.

Additional Learning Support

The development of English and mathematics skills is an intrinsic part of all courses. Students will continue to develop these essential skills throughout their study programme. If you are yet to achieve a 9-4/A*-C GCSE you will continue to study a range of English and mathematics qualifications including functional skills and GCSEs to work towards this.





Apprenticeships at Hadlow College

Why not start to build your career with an apprenticeship?

Did you know Hadlow College is one of the country's leading land-based Colleges.

No matter what stage you are within your career, whether just starting out in the world of work or already an established member of staff, Apprenticeships can support you to develop your skills, knowledge and behaviours in your chosen profession via an apprenticeship scheme, and is perfect solution to earn while you learn.

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a real job that gives you a learning platform to train and develop your skills, knowledge and behaviours in your chosen profession.

20% of your contracted working hours will be spent in training and development, either with us at college, or even in your workplace. The remainder of your time will be spent applying and developing your skills and knowledge deeper in your workplace.



Apprenticeship FAQs

Do Apprentices get paid?

As an apprentice, you'll usually be employed to work a minimum of 30 hours per week and be paid a wage no less than the National Minimum Apprenticeship Rate - £4.81 per hour, for the time you are in work and in off-the-job training.

You can also undertake an apprenticeship if you are a part time employee, in these circumstances we will review your part-time working hours and extend the duration of your apprenticeship to ensure you receive the required level of training needed.

The amount you are paid is based on several factors including your previous experience and current skill set. Within some job roles your wage may increase as you progress and take on more responsibility. You will also receive the same benefits as any employee, including holiday pay.

Who can do an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are open to anyone who is 16 years old and over, has a right to work in England and is not in full time education. There is no upper age limit and available to anyone whether starting out on their career or for those who have been working for some time.

You will be involved in all aspects of the farming year including lambing, shearing, ploughing and harvest - and assist with the College's beef herd. We also have close links with local dairy farms so you'll get all the experience of dairy herd management as well. Our beef herd forms part of the College's wider re-generative farming strategy that helps improve the environmental credentials of the farm and provides excellent learning for students. By studying a course in Agriculture, you

can become part of an industry which is key to the production of food, preservation of the countryside and ongoing survival of the rural economy. The Agricultural team have a array of experience ranging from crop, soil, plant, livestock, machinery and business management, and bring this knowledge and experience to the delivery of the courses.

Providing a comprehensive introduction to all aspects of animal care, students will benefit from a mix of theory combined with a large degree of practical work in our custom-built animal management unit.

Students will learn about the structure and function of the animal body, animal welfare, animal health and nursing. Throughout the courses, students are required to complete work experience to develop practical skills, both on the animal unit and externally. Undertaking practical duties

as part of their course, students benefit from a wide range of experiences and opportunities to work with both exotic and domestic animal species.

Students are involved in all aspects of husbandry and management from planning animal collections, designing and maintaining enclosures to day-to-day animal care within an animal collection set up as a commercial enterprise. Students benefit from using the most up-to-date equipment in the aquaria, pet trade and zoological fields.

HADLOW COLLEGE

Our Equine Unit at Hadlow has extensive facilities including two indoor arenas, a large outdoor arena and stabling for 64 horses. As well as a complete range of show jumps, there are also cross country fences suitable for students training at Level 3 and above. There is a horse walker, high speed treadmill and an extensive range of practical teaching resources.

Students have exceptional opportunity to gain genuine hands on practical experience as well as ride and compete quality horses. They gain knowledge and develop their practical skills in horse husbandry, horse handling, grooming, application of tack and equipment, feeding and routine yard management. Students will also study horse behaviour and welfare, anatomy and learn how to work a horse correctly on the flat, and over fences, if the riding option is chosen. In addition to the development of vocational skills, students will develop transferable skills such as; team work, effective communication, presentation skills and problem solving. Students benefit from field trips to a variety of events and significant equine establishments. In the past these have included; The New Forest, Windsor Horse Show and The King's Troop. Opportunity is also given to students to compete and help at College run shows using our horses.

HADLOW COLLEGE

Facilities at the Royal Borough of Greenwich Equestrian Centre include: 20 internal stables, indoor and outdoor riding arena, mechanical horse, equine therapy centre (with pool, hydro treadmill, spa and solarium), specialist classrooms / labs and treatment / demonstration areas. There are horses ranging from school masters and ex-competition horses to young-stock, ensuring students are able to progressively develop their skills during the course. Students receive excellent support from a team of highly qualified teaching staff with extensive and diverse experiences within the equine sector. The experience of training with excellent resources, combined with high expectations, both in lessons and during practical duties, gives every student the best opportunity to achieve.

Students have exceptional opportunity to gain genuine hands-on practical experience as well as ride and compete quality horses. They gain knowledge and develop their practical skills in horse husbandry, horse handling, grooming, application of tack and equipment, feeding and routine yard management. Students will also study horse behaviour and

Students benefit from field trips to a variety of events and significant equine establishments. In the past these have included: The New Forest, Windsor Horse Show and The King's Troop. Opportunity is also given to students to compete and help at College run using our horses.



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Hadlow College has a new 3 hectare orchard growing a range of crops on the main campus. This exciting development focuses on sustainability, reducing labour where possible and allows us to work collaboratively with industry and importantly inspire the next generation of fruit growers and horticulturists.

The orchard is automated using a range of robotic equipment and sensors to remove much of the labour intensive aspects but develop the highly skilled labour requirements of orchard management.

The crops grown include Apple, Pears, Cherries, Apricots and other Prunus. A section of the orchard is devoted to viticulture producing a crop of grapes but with the training emphasis being on how to set up and manage a vineyard. Cherries grown under plastic and intensive production systems are used to maximise the potential yield of all crops. The planning of the orchard was conducted in conjunction with industry to ensure we are meeting future demands.

The crops are grown with sustainability in mind at all times. Drones are used to monitor bud set, predict yields and monitor the growth of the crop allowing precise applications of nutrition, pest and disease control methods to be used.

Sensors are installed throughout the orchard to monitor amongst other things moisture, relative humidity, PAR, rain fall plus other exciting sensors which are currently being developed.

Post-harvest technology will include new cold store facilities with lab based research storage facilities to help better understand the implications of long term storage of fruit. Hadlow College has a rich history of fruit production, working with industry and providing training opportunities for students. This latest development is an exciting opportunity for industry to engage with the college to shape the future of the fruit industry in Kent and further afield.



Land & Wildlife Management

Hadlow Campus

This course has a mixture of practical and theory lessons and is delivered to make use of the excellent resources we have on site and the range of experience within the faculty team. This qualification covers the skills and knowledge required for you to enter employment in the countryside sector specialising in land and wildlife management industries.

This qualification gives you the opportunity to study a range of specialist technical practical skills and gain knowledge that builds upon the skills required for working in the countryside management sector such as estate maintenance skills, population surveys, safe use of equipment and machinery with further areas of study such as land use and recreation. It will enable you to develop specialist skills such as woodland and coastal habitat management, river fishery management and habitat management learning on our large estate.

This is a one-year, full time qualification. Practical and theory lessons will take place throughout your study programme and we work with local employers who will contribute to the delivery of your qualification by providing talks and offering work experience. In addition, trips will occur to support your learning experience. The course is assessed via internally set assignments and externally set exams.

You can progress onto a Level 3 Advanced Technical Diploma Land and Wildlife Management (Year 2) Countryside or Fisheries stream. HE to study towards careers in fisheries management, conservation and biodiversity.

Options after your GCSEs

GCSEs


There are many options after your GCSEs, from vocational programmes, to A Levels, to apprenticeships and they can all lead to your chosen career, but what are the best routes for you? Here's an idea of the paths you can take.

Levels of study

Depending on GCSE results (or predicted results), our tutors will recommend what level of study to apply for. This will be discussed at interview, but can be moved at enrolment after GCSE results.

As you can see, after GCSEs, students can start at Entry Level or Level 1 or 2 which are completed in 1 year and move to Level 3 which is equivalent of A Levels, or you can go straight into a Level 3 programme and move onto Level 4, university or into employment once completed.

For students wishing to go to university or study Higher Education programmes, a Level 3 Extended Diploma is required by universities in the subject (or closely related subject) to the one you wish to study. We have a number of courses that can lead to university.

Student Financial Support

We know that education is priceless. At Hadlow, wherever possible, we try to ensure that no student is unable to study due to financial constraints and have in place a number of different schemes to support you, whatever course you choose.

If you are aged 16-18 (under 19 on 31st August 2021) you will not be charged tuition fees or examination fees for the courses in this guide. There may be charges for essential equipment and trips associated with certain courses. You can find out about these at interview or by visiting our website: www.hadlow.ac.uk

16-18 Year Old students can apply for assistance with the additional course costs, residential onsite accommodation (Hadlow Students only) and travel, through the college bursary. All bursaries are awarded in accordance with Government Guidelines and the college policies and eligibility criteria.

If you are aged 19+ you may be eligible to receive financial help with course fees. If you do not hold a level 2 qualification (e.g. 5 GCSEs at Grades A*-C/9-4) or a level 3 qualification (e.g. 2 A-Levels) and are under 23 years old, you may be able to get a substantial reduction



in your fees. You may also be able to claim for free or discounted courses at level 1 and entry level if you're aiming for a level 2 course, do not already have a auglification at this level and are under 23 years old.

Children in Care and Young Care Leavers

If you are 16-18 and in the care of the local authority, or you have recently left care and are living independently, you may be entitled to a £1,200 bursary from the Government to support your studies.

Free College Meals

Students must be aged between 16 and 18 on 31 August 2022 to be eligible for a free meal in the 2023-24 academic year and meet the eligibility criteria. Students who turn 19 during their study programme will remain eligible for a free meal until the end of the academic year in which they turn 19, or to the end of their study programme, whichever is sooner. Student's aged between 19 and 25 who have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHC Plan) and European Social Fund (ESF) are also entitled to a free meal while attending their provision, if they meet the eligibility criteria.

16-18 Vulnerable Young Persons Bursary

If you are in financial difficulties, you can apply for Students from groups identified by the Government as support with travel, course-related costs and childcare. vulnerable can apply for the 16-18 Vulnerable Young All awards made by the College are subject to eligibility Persons Bursary. Travel Costs

Your Local Education Authority (LEA) may be able to help you financially, for example with your travel costs. You would usually need to be living at home with your parents/ guardians and may be asked to make a contribution to the costs. The amount you would receive is dependent on the cost of the transport minus your contribution. Please contact your LEA for more information.

Advanced Learner Loans

If you're over 19, have lived in the UK for more than three years and are considering a further education course at Level 3 or above you may be eligible for the Government's new 19+ Advanced Learner Loans. Similar to the loans available for higher education students, it is not means-tested or credit checked - if you meet the criteria you will be able to apply regardless of whether you're employed or unemployed.

You will also only begin to pay the loan back once you're earning over £27,295 and, in the same way as the higher education tuition loans, it is written off after 30 years.

To apply you need to be:

- Aged 19 or over at the start of your course
- Resident in the UK for three years
- Studying an approved Level 3, 4, 5 or 6 qualification (such as A-Levels, Access to Higher Education (HE), Extended Diplomas and Advanced Apprenticeships).

Financial Support

You may also need to purchase some specialist equipment to study certain courses, with much of the equipment listed on the course pages being available to purchase through the College. Full details of these additional costs will be given to you at your interview. Please note that, at the time of going to press, Floristry fees are £650.00.

Application is received Once we have received your application, we will check you have given all the information we need and contact you have not.

You will be invited for interview After your application has been processed, we will invite you in for interview. This is your chance to discuss your course options with the tutor. You will be asked to bring your latest school report with you. Interviews generally take place throughout the year, but demand is high so do not be alarmed if your interview date seems to be a long way away. Our aim is to contact you with an interview date within three weeks of receiving your application.

The Interview This is our chance to learn more about you, and your chance to find out about us. At the end, you will be offered an unconditional place or a conditional place based on GCSE results. Occasionally, we may decide to offer you an alternative course which, after consultation, we believe is more suitable.

Confirmation of our offer We will confirm our offer to you in writing and you will be asked to sign and return the acceptance form. Once we have received this, your place on the course will be reserved and details of accommodation, finance and fees will be sent to you.

Enrolment Over the summer, you will be sent joining instructions and details of what will happen at the start of term. Enrolment normally takes place at the beginning of September. If you are receiving exam results in August and they do not turn out as you had hoped, then do not panic. If they are close to the original requirements, then the offer may stand. If not, our Admissions team will do their best to place you on a different level course in the same subject area.

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So, you've found the perfect course, really like the look of the College and are ready to apply. The question is, how do you go about it?

It's simple really, visit **www.hadlow.ac.uk** and apply online. If you're a Year 11 student at a Kent school, you are also able to apply through the Kent County Council online system, your school will be able to provide more information.



What are T Levels?

T Levels are new courses for 16-18 year olds which follow GCSEs and are equivalent to 3 A levels. These 2-year courses, have been developed working with employers so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for skilled employment, higher study or apprenticeships.

T Levels offer students a mixture of classroom learning and 'on-the-job' experience during an industry placement of at least 315 hours (approximately 45 days). Students get valuable experience in the workplace and employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry.

T Levels include:

- Technical knowledge and practical skills specific to the student's chosen industry or occupation
- An industry placement of at least 45 days in their chosen industry or occupation
- Relevant English and maths skills
- Common workplace skills

Students who achieve a T Level will get a nationally recognised certificate which employers will use as evidence in their recruitment. T Levels will offer students a mixture of classroom or workshop-based learning and 'on-the-job' experience.
